
`These diverse Buddhist expression, in turn, competed with Brahmanism, Hinduism, and autochthonous animisms. Rather than an organized sectarian lineage, the early religious amalgam in Thailand and other parts of Southeast Asia might be more accurately described as a syncretic collage of miraculous relics and charismatic monks, Hindu dharmasastra, Brahmanic deities, Mahāyāna Buddhas, tantric practices, and Sanskrit Sarvāstivādin and Pāli Theravāda traditions."










Modernization of Buddhist education

Current Thai Buddhism

Buddhism is regarded as the national religion of Thailand because:

- About 95% of Thai people are Buddhist (4% Muslim, 0.5% Christian, 0.5% others)
- The Monarch must be a Buddhist by the constitution.

Buddhism has been the philosophy of life of Thais for over 1,000 years and has significance influence upon the character, the mind and way of life of Thai people.

Current Thai Buddhism

Buddhism is the foundation of Thai culture and civilization, the creative force behind literature, sculpture, architecture, fine arts, drama, songs and music.



Buddhism in Thailand Motives for becoming monks

- **1.** To dedicate one's life for earnest practice of Buddhism.
- 2. For further education for poor children
- 3. For short-term training. It is believed that an ex-monk is well-matured and ready to lead family life.
- 4. To dedicate the merit to parents, especially to mother who cannot be a monk.
- **5. To help preserve Buddhism**
- 6. For other non-Buddhist reasons






Contextualising Thai Sangha


